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There are six cages in the main housing area in which there are three dogs housed together in one cage. The cage does not give all three animals enough room to move around comfortably.

Without enough room, animals can develop joint or bone problems, and if housed together without enough room, animals may become aggressive.

3.9 (b) FEEDING.

Measures must be taken to ensure that there is no molding, deterioration, and caking of feed.

The feeding containers inside the cages in the animal housing area had an accumulation of food particles built up on the inside rail of the containers. This build up was visible in several of the food containers throughout the housing area.

Food containers must be completely clean and free of debris for the health of the animals using the containers. When not cleaned properly, they can build up germs, dust, or mold making the animal sick or attracting parasites.

All items must be in compliance within 2 more inspections or by 02/18/2011 or applicant will forfeit application fee and must wait 6 months to reapply
